MOA HISTORY & MISSION

Founded in 1981 by developer John W. Madden, Jr., Marjorie Madden and daughter, Cynthia Madden Leitner, the Museum of Outdoor Arts is a synthesis of fine art, architecture and landscape design integrated into the community and business environment. Our art collection is primarily located in Englewood and Greenwood Village, within various public locations, as well as throughout the Denver metro area and beyond. From commercial office parks to botanic gardens, city parks and traditional sculpture gardens; art is placed to interpret space as "a museum without walls." Foremost, MOA believes in its mission of "making art a part of everyday life."

One of MOA's primary outdoor locations is Marjorie Park, named after MOA co-founder Marjorie P. Madden. It is located on the north side of Fiddler's Green Amphitheatre. The park reopened in 2021 after an extensive renovation project and features over 40 artworks, including a larger-than-life bronze "Alice In Wonderland" series. Marjorie Park is programmed with several community arts related events, concerts, temporary exhibitions and more! The park is also available to host private and corporate events.

MOA also contributes to the cultural scene through its ownership of Fiddler's Green Amphitheatre. The venue hosts prominent music performances during the outdoor concert season.
